SHARP NOTES Fall 2009

Well, it's the end of summer (*sigh*) and school is about to start or has started for lucky people like me (was the sarcasm too much??). This means lots of changes in schedules. See this issue for changes and updates.
Also, here is a friendly reminder for all lesson clients and lease clients...
If you use it...clean it!!

There has been a lot of damage done to equipment this summer and care has not been taken to make sure that equipment (bridles, brushes, girths, fly spray, etc.) is replaced properly. I know that I am lecturing all the time about equipment maintenance but...this is for your safety! Poorly maintained

tack and equipment is a danger to you when you ride.

If you use it...put it away. If you use it up...replace it!!

- Make sure that fly spray bottles are turned to the closed position when not in use. They tip over and fly spray leaks out onto the floor. At \$25.00 a bottle, this is a costly oversight.
- Make sure that all girths, bits and saddle pads are wiped off before putting them away. This keeps the sweat from accumulating and causing sores on your horse.

I am beginning to replace all the leather lesson equipment with nylon or synthetic equipment. Synthetic tack requires less maintenance and is lighter. Because of this change, all the leather lesson equipment will be for sale. This includes saddles, girths, cinches, sadldlepads and bridles. See partial list in this issue.

After a July lull in shows, they are picking back up again! See this issue for a schedule of shows. Good news!! The new show bill for the Not Summer Series horse shows is attached as well. People are beginning to enter now, so if you are interested in showing a lesson horse, please see

Mary. Leases are available as well this fall on all lesson horses. Thank you all for a great summer! We were lucky to have many nice days to ride and enjoy time at the barn!



OPEN RIDES:


Open ride times are whenever I have regular scheduled lessons. Please call Mary for times and dates.




